

Patient-reported Quality of Life in Clinical Oncology Practice

Dear colleagues,

The role of quality of life and other patient-reported outcomes in evaluating cancer treatments has changed dramatically. Quality of life is no longer considered "just another secondary endpoint" in clinical trials. Rather, the patient perspective of the effects of the disease and its treatment on their own well-being is now considered one of the most important outcomes and its thorough evaluation has led to practice-changing results both in palliative and in curative cancer treatment. However, implementing the measurement of quality of life into the routine care of cancer patients is still a challenge.

Ten years ago, the Quality of Life and Ethics Work Group was formed within the German Radiation Oncology Society, DEGRO. The group has successfully performed a number of prospective pilot and multi-center studies, relating to quality of life in patients undergoing radiotherapy, to patient information in oncology and to the job stress of professionals in oncology.

The Medical Faculty of the Martin Luther University Halle-Wittenberg has a strong background in oncology nursing research, in supportive care in cancer and in research in patient-reported outcomes.

We have, therefore, planned to integrate the competence of distinguished international speakers from the Quality of Life Group of the European Organization for Research and Treatment of Cancer (EORTC), the DEGRO Work Group and experts from Halle to discuss current issues of evaluating quality of life and other PROs in the clinical routine of oncology.

The symposium and workshop are open to all interested professionals. We will be happy to welcome you in Halle, the birth place of composer Georg Friedrich Händel, and we are looking forward to exciting discussions both in the auditorium and at the get-together.
